With Clementine of Aqua Moon

This month's stand out feature is without doubt the total lunar eclipse, which will be visible all up and down the eastern sea board of Australia. The NASA website puts this as the longest lunar eclipse of the last 100 years. For those of you with a good astronomical understanding the eclipse should begin at 17:54 when it enters the penumbral and ends at the same point at 23:21. The exact time of the full Moon is 20:37, which then coincides with timing of high point of the eclipse.

For those of us interested in the astrological meaning of the eclipse we note that the eclipse falls over the Virgo/Pisces axis at 4° 46'. Eclipses are, by their very nature, episodes when the lights of the sky (Sun and Moon) are for a time hidden from our sight. The Sun or the Moon are in a period of darkness before they slowly proceed back into the light. It has been suggested that while the Sun or the Moon are in their state of darkness they are collecting those hidden aspects encompassed in that chart point and take those aspects back out with them into the light for examination. As with any grand scale astrology/astronomy event we need to go back into our own charts to decide whether this particular eclipse will have any real impact on us as an individual. The houses in your chart that contain the 4° Virgo/Pisces 46' axis will be the areas of life that may come under the microscope for the next few weeks. Conjunctions, squares and oppositions (with no more than a two degree orb) to any of the personal planets will also have a particular effect as will the same aspects to any of the angles.

Even if we put the eclipse to one side for the moment and just look at the effects of a Piscean Full Moon we recall that a Moon in Pisces puts the emotional spotlight on all things hidden below the surface. The balance of this particular Full Moon is about looking at our response to all things Piscean – how empathetic are we? How are we dealing with outside stress? Do we go for the bottle or do we sit with the pain? Is it fight or flight when we need to deal with the more sinister sides of ourselves? The call from the Virgo opposition is to take the focus off ourselves and put the energy into others (service). How often have we heard the advice when it seems life and all its demands are just too overwhelming to move out of ourselves and focus on others – our particular concerns are soon put into perspective.

With every Full Moon there is a preceding New Moon which this month falls at 19° Leo 50' and which occurs on 13 August at 09:03. I find New Moons in Leo a bit of an enigma. On the one hand we have the darkness of the New Moon and on the other we have the Leo energies urging us to shine. The New Moon chart is a really interesting one. We see a full line up of planets accompanying the Sun and Moon in Leo. We have Mercury at 16°, Sun and Moon at 19° and Saturn and Venus at 27°. The exact Saturn Venus conjunction is a story in itself - time to get real about what we value, time out to look at our most intimate relationships and possibly time to review the budget. With Venus still in a retrograde state these deliberations will probably occur deep within, the manifestations will become obvious the next time Venus and Saturn meet on 13 October.

We also see in the New Moon chart Neptune opposing our Leo line up. Another call to make real what we desire, ask the tough questions of ourselves – are we chasing butterflies or are we prepared to put in the hard yards to make our dreams come true?

Other planetary movements for the month find Jupiter moving direct again on 7 August after remaining stationary at 9° Sagittarius 55'. Mercury makes his way through the tail end of Cancer and then into Leo on 5 August (*communication on a grand scale*). During the month it continues on into Virgo meeting up with the exacting sign on 20 August. Mars leaves Taurus on 8 August to begin its almost two month stay in Gemini. Our energies will now be directed into all things relating to communication. Combine the sextile of the Mars Gemini with the Mercury Leo and the resultant Mars opposition and Mercury trine to the newly released Jupiter and we should see a virtual talkfest for the second week of the month.

Don't forget our AGM is on Saturday September 1 at 1:30pm and will as brief as possible so we can get on with Tess Cullen's presentation on Hygeia, which will be presented over the whole afternoon. The cost for the afternoon will be \$10 for members and \$12 non-members. Greg will present a talk in October bringing in the Pluto in Capricorn theme and Geoff Marx will be our final speaker of the year in November, also a Plutonic theme.

Planet Watch

Welcome to your eye in the sky for August, this month features include a Full Moon Total Lunar Eclipse. The lunar eclipse will occur on August 28, at 20:37 AEST, and will be visible from all eastern states.

Mercury is in superior conjunction (Mercury and Earth on opposite sides of Sun) on the 16th, and is lost from view until next month when it reappears in the evening sky.

Venus is visible low in the western twilight sky early in the month. The planet soon becomes lost in the Sun's glare as it moves into inferior conjunction (between the Earth and Sun) on the 18th. The size and brightness (magnitude) of Venus has increased dramatically over the last month as it approaches the Earth. Venus is lost in the evening sky, reappears in the morning sky at months end and remains a morning star until July 2008.

Mars is visible in the early morning sky rising around 02:00 am, and will remain in the morning sky until early November; the planet is also increasing in magnitude in the coming months as the Sun slowly moves toward the red planet, making its conjunction with the planet in November.

Jupiter can be seen high in the northern sky after dark and remains within 5 degrees of the fixed star Antares in the middle of the constellation Scorpio. The planet finally begins its slow forward (direct) motion around the 7th of the month.

Saturn is falling into the abyss with the evening sunset, and the planet will have its meeting with the Sun this month on the 22nd reappearing in the morning sky in September.

Finally, I would like to introduce some key words used in Astronomical world. I will be over the coming months writing a glossary on these terms, (*words taken from Astronomy 2007, K. Wallace, G. Dawes, P. North field.*) so I hope you enjoy this exercise and feel free to let me know if there are any terms you would like explained. © Gregory Clare 2007.

(Glossary of Astronomical terms.)

Almanac: A set of tables giving positions of the Sun, Moon and planets at various times, plus other astronomical information; Ephemeris

Altitude: The angular elevation of an object above or below the horizon.

Angular diameter: The apparent diameter of an object measured in degrees.

Angular separation: The angular distance between two celestial bodies measured in degrees.

Aphelion: The point in an orbit of a body most distant from the sun.

Apogee: The point at which a body in orbit around the Earth reaches its farthest distance from the earth.

Asterism: A recognisable grouping of visible stars. The stars may belong to one or more constellations. The grouping will have a name, i.e.; 'The teapot' in Sagittarius.

Astronomical unit: The average distance from Earth to the Sun approximately 149.6 million km, which equals 1 AU.

Azimuth: The horizontal coordinate of an object's position in the sky. Derived by drawing an imaginary vertical line from the object to the horizon below. The position is then expressed in degrees east from the north point.

The Fallout when The Hades Moon Collides with Mars

Being a Moon and Sun Pluto native and currently enjoying the last days of my Progressed Scorpio Moon (yippee) I was very eager to hear Anne's take on Mars, Pluto and the Hades Moon!

Anne began the afternoon discussion with Judy Hall- (astrological author with these aspects) as well as her experiences in regard to these aspects and transits. We also looked at the event chart for the talk and with Scorpio rising and an Aries Moon we were in perfect stead for the day's topic. Some truly amazing artwork was displayed from Anne's sister Sue, who designed some gorgeous Astrology cards.

Like any form of Astrology, looking at other charts is the only way to learn. Anne gave us a history of the life of Emily Bronte, a famed and classic British author showing how Moon, Mars and Pluto aspects afflicted Emily, along with her siblings. She demonstrated the power play, drama, intrigue and abuse that occurred in the lives of the Bronte family, beginning with the death of their mother at a young age. We were taken on a historical journey of her life and her place of birth in the British countryside in Thornton.

Anne also covered in her unique comical style other famous people with the same aspects such as John Lennon. She discussed his 'mother issues' and how this reflected in his life and career as well as his relationship with Yoko Ono. His Moon Pluto opposition manifested being born after a 30hr labour in a bombing raid!

The highlight of the afternoon was Anne's comical account of her own chart and those of friends who carry aspects from Mars, The Moon and Pluto.

The discussion ended with some amazing poetry, penned by Anne. Beautiful poems, which blurred the boundaries (no pun intended) between Neptune and Pluto certainly ended the day with a WOW element!

Two Grande Dames Move On

Today I heard about the leaving of this life by two of the Grandest Females I have ever met. Some of you may find it offensive that I place them in the same piece let alone the same breath, but please don't. To me both these beings were worthy of the utmost respect and admiration, and I held both in the highest esteem and affection.

Doris Greaves

The first is the Grande Dame of Astrology, Doris Greaves. I am sure that over the next few weeks there will be many eulogies written about Doris and her contribution to astrology in Australia and her founding of the FAA. And over the dinner tables there will be much laughter as stories are told about this multiple Leo/Sagittarius larger-than-life lady. Stories I might add, that will, sadly, probably never find their way into print. Doris really was Grande! She could be the most intimidating person a young astrologer could meet, but at the same time she was also the most encouraging and generous - if she liked you! True Leo that she was, if she didn't like you, that was your loss. I was lucky. She liked me and thus I was privileged to be able to learn a great deal from this extraordinary woman. Not as a student but more as an apprentice. She taught me how to write for the media and how to deal with them. She taught me about self-confidence and to believe in myself, and my own abilities. And most of all, she taught me to give back to a profession that I loved and that has been good to me. In other words, she taught me those things one can't learn in a classroom. Thank you Doris. I know you will still be passing on that advice in the hallowed halls to which you have gone.

Fifi

The other Grande Dame who has also moved on was named Fifi, and she was the matriarch of the Taronga Zoo Chimp Community. Some of you may remember the astrological study and lecture I did on chimpanzees in 1984, and coincidentally I will be doing this same lecture by request, at UAC in Denver in May 2008! Fifi was extraordinary as she turned 60 last May. I grew up with Fifi! She was the oldest chimp in the world when she died and over the years provided researchers with a wealth of information about these wonderful animals - our 1st cousins!

I know she has little to do with astrology, but as Doris was the Grande Dame of the Australian astrological community, and brought Aussie astrology to world prominence, so Fifi was the Grande Dame of Taronga Zoo, and brought our chimps to world attention many, many times. Doris founded the Australian astrological community and Fifi founded the Australian chimpanzee community. Both knew their position and relished it; both will have stories told about them for many years to come. Thank you both for what you have given and taught me. You will both live on in my heart.
