Midpoint Magic Peta High

This topic is one, which has been neglected for a long time. In fact there are very few lectures on midpoints held in our library from at least 8 Conferences. Peta High speaks very quickly and succinctly. She knows her subject well, and has many years experience as a teacher, so she knows how to capture the audience and hold their interest, as well as how to actually teach the subject.

Her enthusiasm for using the technique of midpoints is contagious. Firstly she explains the history, then the method, and finally gives example charts to demonstrate their accuracy in prediction. During one of these examples (Tony Blair), she actually forecasts his resignation as British Prime Minister as taking place this year, when Pluto transits the midpoint of his Ascendant/Midheaven - which midpoint is related to the vocation - and the lecture was given in January 2006.

Peta demonstrates how midpoints can be used natally, with transits and progressions, and in synastry - although she has another complete lecture on just that topic. She describes a good astrologer as a good technician - one who has command of many techniques. This CD is definitely worth the time if you are looking for another tool to add to your astrologer's tool bag.

With Clementine of Aqua Moon

The heavy emphasis on the Pisces/Virgo axis continues this month with the Solar Eclipse on 11 September. The Sun and Moon will be lining up at 18° Virgo 25' at 10:45pm. As we have noted on previous occasions Solar Eclipses mark a time of personal or egotistical reflection in the very least, transformation at the very best, this will depend on where the Eclipse falls in your chart and what planets it may effect.

The Pisces Virgo story started (this time round) in late June 2006 when the Nodes took up their opposing position on the 23rd of that month. At that time we were first reintroduced to the notion of learning how not to sweat the small stuff. The idea was back in our faces in March this year when we played out the Total Lunar Eclipse March 4 with the Sun (Pisces) and Moon (Virgo) at 13° 00' and then the Partial Solar Eclipse at 28° Pisces 07'. The emphasis in March was more on the Pisces energy (naturally) – this time we are asked to focus on the Virgo side of things. This is our last chance to learn to balance this polarity before the Nodes move in December.

Before the Aquarian/Leo axis takes over it might be a good time to pause and reflect on how much we have learned to let go. And how much we have learned from stepping outside of the eternal, analytic, inner chatter of Virgo and allowed ourselves to bathe in the cosmic waters of Pisces. Have we been able to make our dreams a reality?

Somehow this seems to be the call of the Solar Eclipse (even if it is only a partial one). Interestingly enough we find Uranus (16° Pisces 38') in opposition to the Solar Eclipse – so no matter how wacky those dreams, we are being called to trust their messages and put them into practice.

The exact Uranus opposition to the Sun also comes just at the end of a time when the chart has played host to a mutable grand cross. For the better part of the first two weeks of the month we see Sun (Virgo) square Jupiter (Sagittarius) square Uranus (Pisces) and square Mars (Gemini). And while mutable grand crosses have the benefit of being adaptable they also demand action is taken to relieve the frustration – in the end a decision needs to be made. A little bit like what we have been experiencing with our Pisces/Virgo axis – it's one thing to be spiritually inspired, it's another thing to live in the real world.

The Full Moon this month falls on September 27 at 5:46pm when the Sun and Moon oppose each other at 03° Aries/Libra 21'. This being the first Full Moon after the equinox of September 23 it will be the wonderful, huge, yellow Harvest Moon that creeps up over the horizon just on dinner time. Let's hope we have a clear night to enjoy the spectacle. Other standout features for September include the end of the retrograde periods for Venus and Pluto. Pluto goes direct on 7 September after having stationed at 26° Sagittarius 18'.

This was the last Pluto retrograde period in this sign. In a way it is our last opportunity to bring out into the physical world and work with all those beliefs and philosophies we have been pondering since 31 March when Pluto started this final backward movement or indeed even further back when Pluto first entered Sagittarius in January 1995. Transformations have been happening deep within and the house Pluto has been transiting in your chart indicates the area of life that has been most effected.

Venus ends her retrograde period the very next day – 8 September after having stationed at 16° Leo 35'. So again we finish a time of reflection. This time we need to bring out our revised set of values - what is important to us now that maybe wasn't so important back at the end of July when Venus turned inwards.

Lastly we see Saturn move into Virgo, this happening way back at the start of the month – 2 September at 10:14pm to be exact (which is what Saturn in Virgo expects!!) and Mars, which moves into Cancer at the very end of the month – 29 September at 9:29am.

Planet Watch

Welcome to September's planet watch - your eye in the sky. This month features include a continuation of the Astronomical Glossary, a Partial Eclipse of the Sun and the Earth at its vernal equinox on September the 23 (Day & Night are equal).

Mercury becomes visible during the middle of month and remains so until mid-October. Mercury reaches its greatest elongation east of the Sun (26°) on September 30 making this an ideal time for early evening observation. As the Sun sets in the west Mercury will shine from around 18:00hr (6:00pm) until falling into the abyss around 19:15hr (7:15pm) allowing plenty of time to take in this elusive trickster.

There is great chance to witness the Moon in action this month with its daytime occultation of the fixed star Regulus and the planet Saturn on September 10. The 28.23-day-old waning crescent Moon passes between both from about 11:00am EST through to 14:00hr EST. (**Warning this should not be attempted with out the aid of proper eye protection**) The Moon is at 12 degrees declination and slides neatly through the fixed star and planet.

On September 23 at 19:51:14 AEST the Earth reaches it's equatorial point, this is known as the Solar (Sun 00:00 degrees) Libra Ingress and both day and night are equal.

September 11 the New Moon forms a Partial Eclipse. The Moon's penumbral shadow passes over a portion of South America, this late-winter Eclipse (Southern Hemisphere) passes through Peru and Brazil with the greatest magnitude occurring hundreds of kilometers offshore from Cape Horn.

Astronomical Glossary

Celestial equator: A projection of the Earth's equator onto the Celestial Sphere.

Celestial Pole: Points on the celestial sphere directly above the Earth's poles about which all the stars seem to rotate; known as the north and south celestial poles (NCP & SCP).

Celestial Sphere: Imaginary sphere of infinite size surrounding the earth, and to which celestial bodies seem to be attached.

Circumpolar: Objects in the sky, which never set. To determine which objects are circumpolar from a particular place, subtract the observer's latitude from 90 degrees. This provides the minimum declination it must have to be considered circumpolar.

Colure index: The difference in the magnitudes of an object measured at two different wavelengths. It is a measure of colure (temperature) of a star.

Coma: The head of a Comet, usually the brightest part.

Comet: Small icy body that orbits the Sun and produces tails of gas and dust when approaching the Sun.

August Speaker Reports

The Astrology of Comedians - Laughter the Best Medicine Presented by Sherrynne Dalby



Why do *you* find something ever so funny and yet *I* am totally bemused by your laughter and amusement? Food for thought isn't it? Sherrynne has explored humour, the diverse types of humour that people respond to and how astrology is able to offer some explanation of the differences in these responses.

Sherrynne spoke of the gender difference humour and informed us that females laugh more often -126% more in fact and that it is males who more often work to get the laughs. She attributed the Moon as our instinctual first response needing something we can empathise with to create our response to humour as it presents. Then you insert other planets that add their flavour - Jupiter the element of slap stick, Saturn the ability of timing, just when to throw that punch line out there and Uranus of course the sense of the ridiculous and the outrageous. As a result you can make some combinations Moon and Jupiter (over the top slapstick), Moon and Saturn (black humour with a strong hint of truth), Moon and Uranus (the totally extreme and ridiculous).

Sherrynne researched the birth charts of 260 comedians in an attempt to discover what makes a funny person funny but discovered no particular chart signature or why the individual styles of humour are evident. What she did discover was a strong emphasis on aspects between the Sun and the chart angles and that the signs Capricorn (ruler Saturn) and Aquarius (ruler Uranus and traditional ruler Saturn) showed up strongly as did hard aspects from Saturn including to the Sun and Mercury. Mercury, which of course shows your communication style showed that squares and conjunctions to Saturn were emphasised to produce the humorous person and Sun-Jupiter oppositions and Scorpio Moons were of note. Sherrynne then used many charts of comedians, Groucho Marx, Bob Hope, Spike Milligan, John Cleese, Robin Williams through to Aussie's Barry Humphries and Graham Kennedy to explain her findings (many of these charts can be found in Solar Fire).

Political Leaders and possibilities for the coming Federal Election Presented by Jonathon Mitchell



The Lunation Cycle and Federal elections what could be the connection? Lunation, loony, and lunatic all derive from the Latin word 'luna' for Moon. Am I beginning to see a connection now as how often do we proclaim some politician lunatics and their ideas as loony or how often do they accuse each other of such traits? No, on the serious side this wasn't what Jon was presenting! It was his research into the elected Prime Ministers of Australia.

Jon examined the progressed charts of the last eight Prime Ministers, since the founding of the Liberal party 1944 and his research has shown that when each of these Prime Ministers entered office they were in the Progressed Moon (PM) waxing cycle.

In looking then to the Progressed Moon Phase for when the above eight left office, Jon noted that Menzies almost completed a full PM cycle and was experiencing the Crescent Phase again. Holt drowned just as his PM moved on from the 1st Quarter Phase, Gorton the PM disseminating phase and Fraser similar while both Whitlam and Hawke were in their PM Waning Phase, (birth no time) as was Keating and now John Howard. So if Howard has a waning PM does that mean Kevin Rudd has a chance at becoming Prime Minister?

Jon went on to look at Kevin Rudd's chart (b21.9.1957 Nambour Qld rectified time) and we found Kevin's Progressed Moon to be also be in the waning phase. Where does that leave matters? Jon then quoted Arthur Bowman who said that in elections you can't tell the outcome for the Country in question but what you can tell is if the person will retain their own seat. Howard's opposition for his seat of Bennelong is Maxine McKew. Maxine a well-known and respected journalist with her most recent TV shows as a reporter and interviewer being [Lateline](#) and [The 7.30 Report](#). Possibly a bit of competition but Maxine has been very coy and all that is currently known is that she was born in Brisbane in 1953 – no date or month. Now that presents a difficulty.

Now, this left us all asking more questions and Jon questioned the audience with the main response was that people didn't believe either Rudd or Howard would win and showed a marked interest in Maxine and also Peter Garrett (b.16.4.1953 Sydney no time yet?). So if anyone has any birth date for Maxine or even better times for Maxine or Peter we would all love to know about it.

Thanks to both Sherrynne and Jon for their research and presentations making the afternoon full and interesting.

UAC Free Speech Lectures: Applications Now Being Accepted.

If you have dreamed about presenting a lecture at UAC but are not on the faculty, a free speech lecture could give you a wonderful opportunity to share your knowledge. In order to be considered for a lecture slot, you must be registered for the main UAC conference as an attendee or vendor, and you must submit a proposal and a biography.

Your proposal must list two topic titles with brief descriptions of each (only one will be chosen). Be sure your biography includes a list of your past speaking experience. It is not necessary that your past talks be astrological in nature, but please indicate your topic(s), tell who your audience was, and give the approximate date(s). Don't forget to include your name and contact information on all materials.

A committee has been formed to review all application materials and to ensure that the Free Speech program offers a wide variety of interesting lectures. Committee members, Ronnie Gale Dreyer, Joe Polise, Pat Taglilatelo, and Donna Van Toen will be accepting applications until September 15, 2007. Please send a copy of your application materials (proposal and biography) to Pat Taglilatelo, patadb@gmail.com. Please be sure to put Free Speech Application in the subject line. Only materials submitted by email can be reviewed.

Each person selected will be assigned one time slot. Please keep in mind that lectures will be one hour in length. Five Free Speech lectures will take place during each of four lunch breaks, from Friday, May 16 through Monday May 19, 2008, for a total of 20 lectures. Classrooms will be assigned but lectures will not be recorded. If you are chosen for a slot and wish to record your lecture, you must provide your own recording equipment. Recordings of your talk will not be available for sale at UAC. Over-head projectors for transparencies and flip charts will be provided for your use. If you wish to include a slide presentation, you will need to provide your own equipment. Speakers are of course required to provide their own lecture materials, including transparencies and handouts. No compensation can be given but the experience will be invaluable to you in your professional career and provides an opportunity to share your astrological insights. UAC faculty members cannot be considered for a Free Speech lecture.

If you are interested, we encourage you to register for the main conference at UAC and to send your complete application materials as soon as possible. Vendors in the trade show are also welcome to apply. No materials will be accepted after September 15, 2007. Keep that date in mind as it is also the Early Bird Registration deadline for UAC, and you must be registered for the conference to be considered for a slot.

The Committee will make every effort to notify successful applicants before December 1, 2007 as to whether their proposals have been accepted. Feel free to pass this announcement on to other astrologers and astrological organizations.
