Antiscion Techniques - Being Who You Are

This lecture was given by Ed Tamplin at the Melbourne Conference of 2006. He takes us for a quick history lesson to Babylon, where the original zodiac was lunar and consisted of 18 signs. Ed explains antiscia and how it can be used in vocational guidance as well as showing what the person will become known for. One of the many example charts he cites is that of Elizabeth Taylor, who although a famous actress, was probably better known for her many marriages.

Ed explains what is important to look for when using the antiscia chart with the natal chart on a Bi-Wheel. Contacts to angles are most important, but house placement should also be considered. He states that the angles can reveal much in the horoscope, since they divide the chart into the four seasons of the year, as well as dawn, noon, dusk and midnight of the daily cycle. Ed demonstrates the use of antiscia on event charts as well, since he concludes that if a technique is valid, it should work on all types of charts. Finally, Sherryne Dalby gives a quick overview on how antiscia can be used in synastry. As usual, this couple delivers a well-prepared and interesting lecture, interspersed with many astrological facts, which you will not find in books. Well worth the time.

Profile
Clementine Adkins – Aquamoon Astrology



My interest in all things astrological began at the time of my mid life transition. My 25yr marriage had just ended when I noticed an advertisement for astrology classes on the back page of a Nature care booklet. For some or other reason the ad captured my imagination and I found myself two weeks later sitting in a class with about 20 other students about to be taken on the ride of my life.

That was back in 1997 and Parampara was our teacher. I was just recovering from the Uranus opposition and the Neptune square which had "done its number on me" some eighteen months earlier. Looking back now I realise I was just being set up for Pluto's crossing of my MC – this time my life was about to change irrevocably. It would be almost impossible to put into words how that initial course changed me forever – Parampara herself said at the end of the four semesters that she had never before seen anyone transform before her eyes as I had over the last fifteen months or so. Possibly the only way I can describe that journey was that I was given the gift of myself. I learnt and understood who I am. Being as heavily "water logged" as I am, emotions/sensitivity/intuition have always ruled my life. This left me feeling a "bit unusual" in a world that has no time or understanding of an inner world.

Parampara gave me a thirst to know more, to dig deeper. That came in the form of two years correspondence classes with Astrologos (Bernadette Brady and Darrelyn Gunzberg). I found I missed the class interaction though and so moved on to Alia Ryder's classes in 2002 where I completed my studies and started the exam process with the FAA. Towards the end of classes with Parampara, I started toying with the idea of teaching astrology. I wanted to give something back, I wanted to assist others on the same journey as I had been on (and am still on). Personal astrology readings for friends soon turned into readings for acquaintances and then for total strangers.

Over time this gave me confidence in my astrological learning and the courage to further pursue the idea of working with astrology. My first astrological foray into the public domain was in 2003 with the writing of the past lives astrology content pages for *imode*, a Telstra driven mobile phone internet site.

Aquamoon was formed at the time my partner and I moved to the Blue Mountains – July 2005. Since then I have had the time to write course and workshop material ("*Astrological fingerprints*" and "*Moonlight*" weekend workshops are complete with ideas on the drawing board for three other weekend workshops – FAA syllabus directed classes commence this March in Blackheath). The Aquamoon website, which went live in October 2005, was a huge project in itself.

Besides much of the usual content found on astrology Websites, Aquamoon has as its prize feature a monthly astrology journal with daily sun and moon positions and any relevant aspects with interpretations. It is our wish that at some time in the future we will have the resources to publish the journal.

How about that Lunar Eclipse!!?? Was it just us sensitive water types that were knocked for a six with our ruler's energies being blitzed by the astral phenomena or did the Virgo Pisces weighted individuals also come along for the ride?? Certainly those in the know were picking up on some sort of energy hiccup and it seems many of us were faced with some very Virgoan attitudes that needed attention.

Mind you as we enter into the month of April we haven't quite done with the challenge of letting go of the eternal self-flagellation. The yod which accompanied the lunar eclipse and which had the moon under the spotlight moves on now to have the finger of god pointed fairly and squarely (well not exactly squarely as we have two quincunx aspects here ☐) at the south node in Virgo. Again there is much pressure to separate away from self-analytical and self critical pressures by a Sun in Aries who just wants to get out there and explore and Chiron in Aquarius who is looking for a chance to feel like they make a difference in the larger scheme of things.

For those of us feeling like there has been a big black cloud hanging around (and this probably does not relate at all to the Sagittarian/Jupiter influenced) know that the light is about to go on again very shortly with Saturn moving direct (after stationing at 18° Leo 09') on 19 April. The retrograde period of Saturn, which has been in effect since 5 December 2006, has often been referred to as the "Dark Night of the Soul". Many of us will have had to face this "would be, could be, should be" planet as it points its finger in our direction and demands we take responsibility for the things in life we would like to blame onto others. By the end of a Saturn retrogradation period many of us will have had to face up to some very harsh truths about ourselves and invariably we will have needed to make changes accordingly.

Whereas the inner world may have felt like a pretty cold and dismal place for the last few months, on 6 April Jupiter takes up residence with Saturn in the secret and hidden areas of our psyches. After a stationery period at 19° Sagittarius 46' Jupiter will now remain retrograde until 7 August. Here is another opportunity to look our truths and beliefs and to be honest enough with ourselves to change those areas of our own personal philosophies that are no longer working for us.

In the time frame where our two interpersonal planets are cohabiting in retrogradation they form a fire trine with the Sun first off and then shortly after with Mercury, both in Aries. The activating sextile in both cases points to Neptune in Aquarius, which gives us the gift of spiritual revelations.

Maybe when we look back over the last few months we might find that the benefits of our retrograde friends has indeed manifested in the spiritual areas of our lives.

And on that same note we find the new moon, which this month falls in Aries (27° Aries 05' at 21:37 on 17 April) having its ruler Mars in its fall position in Pisces. Energies this new moon may be centred more around a spiritual campfire rather than the more obvious tribal corroboree usually associated with Aries. But whether it be a spiritual or tribal gathering we can expect a bit of fun and games as the new moon is based in the fifth house of the Sydney chart.

The full moon falls on 3 April at 3:14am – the opposition falling at 12° Aries/Libra 35'. This polarity calls for a balance between being self focussed and being other focussed, something we all had to face up to in the previous Aries/Libra nodal transit, so not really unfamiliar territory.

Finally the month finds Mercury moving into Aries on 11 April (*watch that communication doesn't turn into confrontation if you judge you are not being heard*) and then on into Taurus on 27 April (*here our words will be more carefully chosen*). Venus moves into Gemini on 13 April (*a chance for a bit of frivolous social fun*) and finally Mars heads into Pisces on 7 April (*our actions will be tempered by compassion and empathy*). Enjoy the month.

JUPITER IN SAGITTARIUS
Nothing Exceeds Like Excess

It's not drawing too long a bow to liken Sagittarian Jupiter to a big man riding a giant horse, heading for a gunfight at the nearest OK Corral. Sagittarius is Latin for archer, and the Sagittarii is what the Roman legions termed their horseback bowmen. While the modernist perceives Sagittarius as a futuristic, adventurous sign: the seeker of truth and travel: it also has the potential for political and/or religious extremism and sophisticated weaponry.

The ruling planet of Sagittarius is Jupiter, also known as Jove, the Roman god of justice. The Greek parallel was Zeus, the sky and thunder god who ruled Mt Olympus, and the Nordic archetype Thor. When Jupiter aligns with Sagittarius, Thor's thunderbolts come to earth, justice is front-page news, and exaggerated ideologies elevate commoners to kings.

The missionary zeal of this astro-signature was evident in William of Orange, the real life Thor of the Netherlands. Or Maximilian Robespierre the quintessential figure of the French Revolution. Or the Ayatollah Khomeini whose return to his homeland heralded a people's revolution and the creation of the Iranian Islamic Republic.

The romantic visionary William Blake, himself born with a Sun/Jupiter conjunction in Sagittarius, exposed the overkill of the amalgam when he wrote, 'Prudence was a rich, ugly, old maid courted by incapacity', and 'you never know what is enough unless you know what is more than enough'.

And true to it's judicial archetype Jupiter in Sag has accompanied many controversial court battles from the O.J. Simpson murder trial, the Azaria Chamberlain baby/dingo mystery, the Nuremburg 'nazi doctors' revelation, to Stalin's public purge, and the mock trial that marked the rise of a fledgling Feuhrer.

In 1924, a young political visionary imprisoned in Bavaria was dictating the pains of his patriotic struggle in 'Mien Kampf', following his arrest for high treason. The sentence appropriately handed down on April Fool's Day meant Adolf Hitler would be free by Christmas.

Meanwhile in Italy Mussolini's Fascist party rose to dominance. On the other side of Europe the death of Russian Revolution leader Vladimir Lenin cleared the way toward Josef Stalin's power surge. And in the USA J. Edgar Hoover was appointed head of the FBI. The events embodied the Yeats line; 'The best lack all conviction, while the worst are full of passionate intensity.'

When Jupiter next returned to the sign of the archer Adolf Hitler would be leading an emerging Germany, host of the Olympic Games of 1936. In March that year, the Fuehrer's troops re-occupied the Rhineland breaking the Treaty of Versailles. Mussolini added his support authorising the Pact of Steel, a Rome/Berlin Axis. Then on November 25 Hitler signed 'an agreement meant to protect European culture and civilisation from the Bolshevik menace' with Japan.

In Communist Russia, Stalin, demonstrating a brutal authority, had sixteen political prisoners executed after a bizarre public trial, effectively routing his homeland opposition. The political polarity of Europe played out in the Spanish Civil War with the Communists and Fascists supplying assistance to the warring parties. In the Middle East the battle between Jewish settlers and nationalists began in earnest with the Arab Revolt. And in the midst of these extremities US activist Abbie Hoffman was born.

Abbie was later to muse, "I believe in compulsory cannibalism. If people were forced to eat what they killed, there would be no more wars." But Jupiter in Sagittarius had already drawn the bow.

By the time Jupiter returned to home base in October 1947 the Second World War had spread like a grassfire across the globe. The divisions were now mirrored in Berlin itself. A Russian blockade of surface transport led to Allied food drops, and the dissection of the German capital. The seeds of the Cold War were sown across the playing fields of Europe. In the USA, the House of Un-American Activities began their interrogation of suspected 'reds' in Hollywood.

The State of Israel was born with powerful allied support against fierce Arab resistance, and the Palestinian exodus began. On the subcontinent India's partition spawned Pakistan, and North Korea's charismatic leader Kim II Sung proclaimed the republic of North Korea dividing the peninsula.

The following sojourn of Jupiter in Sagittarius by 1959 brought East and West tantalisingly close as the British PM Harold McMillan visited the soviet snows, and USSR leader Nikoli Khrushchev touched down in the USA. But a planned Paris summit between President Eisenhower and Khrushchev was literally shot out of the skies along with a US U2 spy plane over Russian airspace. The Cold War warmed considerably as the US entered Vietnam.

In Transvaal police opened fire killing 56 protesting natives in what has become known as the 'Sharpeville massacre'. It prompted Harold McMillan to say before the South African parliament, "the wind of change is blowing through this continent, and whether you like or not the growth of national consciousness is a political fact." Unamused was the South African PM Henrick Verwoerd, the victim of an attempted assassination that year. Perhaps he could relate to the Allen aside, "I don't believe in the after life, although I am bringing a change of underwear."

Big budgetary blowouts caused by wasteful defense spending encouraged a temporary meltdown of the Cold War. The superpowers were back to the negotiating tables. US President Richard Nixon made a groundbreaking trip to Communist China, and signed the Moscow Pact in 1972 with Soviet leader Leonid Brezhnev.

US combat troops withdrew from Vietnam against the backdrop of a Paris peace treaty. But the division between Israel and Palestine dramatically deteriorated with terrorists executing 25 people at Tel Aviv airport and following up with the Munich Olympic massacre where 9 Israeli hostages were killed.

Terrorism was the new modern warfare for the oppressed. In Africa the winds blew a harder still, General Idi Amin seized power in Uganda. He may have provided inspiration for Vaclav Havel's quip, "True enough, the country is calm. Calm as a morgue or a grave, would you not say?"

The diplomatic gains between East and West became a distant memory by March 1983 as US President Ronald Reagan dubbed the Soviets the 'Evil Empire' and proposed a costly Star Wars missile defense system to protect the US from future nuclear attack.

Meanwhile the USSR shot down a Korean airline 747 Jumbo over Siberia with 269 civilian casualties. And the Middle East literally exploded when Shi'ite rebels drove explosive laden trucks into American and French Beirut headquarters killing 241 US marines and 58 French paratroopers, hastening a US withdrawal. In South Africa McMillan's prophecy was realising with their worst activist bombing outside the South African Air Force HQ.

As Jupiter re-entered Sagittarius in December 1994 the Russian Army attacked the Chechnya capital of Grozny. This entire period coincided with ferocious separatist state. Russia's New Year's Eve assault was repelled with losses of over 2,000 men. Chechen gunmen took 1,500 people hostage in a hospital. Terrorism was back with a bang. The US experienced its worst homeland terrorist attack to date, with the Oklahoma City bombing. Thousands of commuters on five Tokyo subway trains were simultaneously gassed by the crazed Japanese religious cult, called Aum Supreme Truth, an atypical Jupiter in Sagittarius logo.

In Manila the seeds of September 11 were uncovered in January of 1995 when Philippine intelligence revealed an Islamic terrorist plot to fly coordinated jumbo jets into strategic American targets. And in the Middle-East Israel Prime Minister, Yitzak Rabin, was assassinated by a Jewish zealot for having signed the Oslo Accord with Palestinian leader Yassar Arafat.

Each repetition of Jupiter through Sagittarius produces violent rebellions at perceived injustices, as a charismatic leader rides on the shoulders of the oppressed. Ideological extremities widen whether they are Communist/Capitalist, East/West, Arab/Jew or Christian/Muslim. Forgotten is the Buddha's pearl that there is only one truth and that is there is no truth.

Is it no surprise then that on the ingress of Jupiter into Sagittarius we find KGB defector Alexander Litvinenko mysteriously poisoned in London, triggering headlines of a Cold War revived? Or that Sadr City Baghdad experiences the worst day of sectarian violence since the US invasion?

And that leaders like Kim Jong II or Mahmoud Ahmadinejad spring to prominence with extremist policies. Or even that O.J. Simpson is news again, and that Al Gore is being urged to tip the scales of justice with another crack at the big one.

Like Vietnam the US is now facing an Iraq exit strategy, and re-assessing their Middle-East policies, all appropriate to the current astro-signature. The folly is in believing that the status quo will remain the same, or that suppression of indigenous rights will make them go away. It won't – whether the backdrop be Palestine or Fiji! Judgement, as Saddam Hussein would agree, is headline news. And the Berlin Wall of today has relocated to Jerusalem. Righteousness has us back at the OK Corral. We don't have to be there. Arbitration and conciliation is the alternative.

South Africa have been a shining light. In the months preceding Jupiter's entry into Sagittarius in late '94, they abolished apartheid, and became the 'rainbow country' electing freedom fighter Nelson Mandela as President. When Jupiter arrived, the Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC) was established to investigate areas of human rights violations, reparations and amnesty. In 2007 South Africa will take further, often painful and difficult steps, along Freedom Road. The question now is – who will join them?

Planet Watch

Welcome to the April edition of planet watch your eye in the sky. Features this month include the conjunction of Mercury/Uranus, the occultation of the fixed star Antares by the Moon and at the end of the month Mars conjunct Uranus. On April 2 in Sydney at 05:50hrs AEST, Mercury and Uranus make an early morning conjunction with the planets rising up out of the depth of the ocean in the constellation of Aquarius, to enjoy this encounter a pair of 10x optical binoculars would be of great value.

April 7 brings an evening encounter with the waning gibbous moon occulting the royal fixed star Antares in the constellation of Scorpius. This show takes place at around 21:00hrs AEST, again in the east rising up out of the ocean, the tail of the Scorpion making it easy to locate. Some 20mins later Jupiter makes an appearance and at the same time in the western sky, the time Lord Saturn is sinking into the abyss. Venus has made its return to the western sky making a lovely sunset picture as the evening darkness grows.

Finally, at the end of the month, April 29/30 Mars and Uranus have an early morning meeting, with the pair making their appearance at 04:00hrs, and again rising up from the eastern horizon, capping off a great month sky viewing.

April is a great month for anyone wanting to observe the sometimes hard to locate Uranus, with several chances to pinpoint the planet aided by the conjunctions of Uranus, Mercury and Mars.
