Why the Modern Mind Rejects Astrology Richard Tarnas IS22

Richard Tarnas is speaking at our upcoming Conference, and this is a lecture he gave at the ISAR Conference in the US in 2003.

He begins by reminding us that all the work we undertake as astrologers is shadowed by an invisible veil of the modern mind's rejection of astrology, and he further states that we have to deal with an implicit suggestion that what we do is in some way invalid.

Any of us who have been asked what we do for a living will be able to relate to this. Do we place ourselves in the position of being ridiculed for our life's work by actually telling people that we are professional astrologers? Richard says that 'Sun-sign reductionism' is the face of astrology and is therefore seen by the general public as being representative of the art.

He equates this to modern medicine being represented only by snake oil salesmen. He goes on to talk about how we can improve our reputations, and investigates why astrology has come to be viewed in this light. This is an interesting lecture.

With Clementine of Aqua Moon

I found it rather interesting as I worked through the charts for the month of October, a month dominated by the sign of Libra, a sign dominated by the desire for peace and harmony, that the dominating aspect for the month should be the sextile, with a number of supporting trine aspects. Trine aspects allow the energies to flow freely, causing no real stress (unless you miss the opportunities they may present) and which go a long way to helping you feel in harmony and at peace with the world. (The idea of domination was to honour the energies of Scorpio, which we will encounter at the end of month). I also found it interesting that this month presents no real challenges from a general planetary aspect point of view. Of course if any of the planets are forming hard aspects in your natal chart then your month may look different to the overall picture being painted by the heavenly bodies.

Starting with the New Moon on 11 October, when we have the Sun and Moon lining up at 17° Libra 30' at 3:00pm, we find the luminaries in a sextile aspect to Jupiter (15° Sagittarius 49') and in trine formation to Neptune (19° Aquarius 22'). New Moons are a time of beginnings. Last month's New Moon in Virgo (which was accompanied by the partial solar eclipse) began a month's introspection on the Virgo energies of duty and service, done in the best possible manner. Having finished with those exacting and self critical concerns we now move on into a lunar month which holds the promise of the more gentle and appeasing type energies. The New Moon is sextile to Jupiter and so we expand that desire for balance and harmony, especially in relationships. The New Moon is also trine to Neptune. We may just find a hint of the spiritual coming through this month. Both energies as already suggested will be opportunistic and beneficial to say the least.

The Full Moon of 26 October crosses the Scorpio Taurus axis (02° Scorpio/Taurus 23' at 2:50pm) and is our check in point to see how well we are faring in this New Moon cycle. This Full Moon's opposition reminds us of the pull between the Sun in Scorpio who will be demanding a tearing open of the soul and the Moon in Taurus who will be wanting us to hide our inner world in the mazes under King Minos's castle. Going back to the sextiles and trines theme we see both the Sun and Moon in the Full Moon chart forming sextiles to the nodes – altogether then they form the aspect pattern of a mystic rectangle. Whilst there is plenty support around the edges, let's not allow the outgoing nodal story pull us back into the swamp of thinking that "my best is never good enough, so what the heck, get me another drink" (Virgo Pisces nodal challenge) but rather let's believe that the hard work that accompanies true relationships will bring its own rewards.

Where is this coming from you ask – well let's look at the ruler of the Full Moon – Venus and note that for the majority of the month Venus is in close conjunction to Saturn. Hard work in relationships is one of the possible outcomes of this more difficult aspect for the month. Whether we find ourselves needing to give that little extra to our relationships or whether we need to get out the budget sheets and do a little revising (a pulling in of the proverbial belt) remains for you to discover. Again don't let the nodes pull you back for we find their theme clinging to the Venus Saturn conjunction while it is in orb.

Other stories for the month feature Mercury, who heads into another retrograde period starting 9 October (stationary at 09° Scorpio 04') and finishing on 2 November at 23° Libra 21'. An interesting feature of this retrogradation is the meeting of Mercury in its backwards motion with the Sun in its forward motion at exactly 00° Scorpio 12' – if it isn't bad enough to have to deal with a retrograde Mercury then how about one that is combust????

Finishing off how we started – on a gentle and harmonious note –the final feature of the month sees Chiron moving direct on 20 October at 10° Aquarius 28'. Here's our chance to try out all the ideas we may have pondered over while it was retrograde, ideas on how we might best deal with the pain of feeling isolated, detached, alone. Maybe you will be lucky enough to gain an invitation to join the local art society. However it manifests – ENJOY.

Planet Watch

Welcome to your eye in the sky for October. This month features Venus/Saturn in the early dawn sky. Well I hope you all enjoyed the Total Lunar Eclipse last month! If you were unfortunate enough to miss this special event, I can only say what shame! It was a brilliant display of heavenly theatre and most Sydneysiders took to the beaches to witness this special event. I found it hard to find a spot to take exposed night photos as people were at every advantage point, I did find a spot and was well rewarded, and I hope you were too.

From the 7th of October through to their conjunction on the 15th, Venus and Saturn again begin to come together, only this time in the early dawn sky and both are again close to the royal fixed star Regulus. At approximately 04:55hr on October 7 in the eastern horizon the 25-day old waning Moon, Regulus, Venus and Saturn rise out of the depth of the ocean forming a tied group. If you get the chance and the weather is favourable then try to catch a glimpse of this rare event as I think you will be rewarded for your efforts. From about, the 7th for 10 days in the early morning dawn sky you can catch these pair as they dance their stuff ahead of the Sunrise. Mercury is visible in the western evening twilight until mid-month. Mercury then moves rapidly back toward the Sun and inferior conjunction on the 24th. This month Mars rises around midnight from the east and has now grown in disc (brightness) and is making a great view as it heads towards its opposition in December.

Jupiter is also visible in the evening sky setting at around 22:00hr, making good evening viewing.

This month I will not be continuing my astronomical terms but will do so next month. Instead I will answer a question asked of me in the hope it may help others.

Question

Hi Greg

I was wondering if you could help me answer a question posed to me regarding the positions of the planets in the signs. This woman was suggesting that even though Venus is currently in Leo, it is occupying that part of heavens deemed to be ruled by cancer. She was suggesting this for most of the planets - that even though astrologically we are suggesting they are in a certain sign, the physical heavens were placing them in the previous sign. Forgive my ignorance but may this have something to do with precession - or of course there may be another explanation altogether.

Does that make sense? Are you able to shed some light on this suggestion?

Answer

The answer to this enquiry is the fact that the earth wobbles (Obliquity) around the north polar stars. This effect means from the earth as we see the stars or constellations they seem to move ever so slowly (precession) 1 degree every 72 years and as result every 26,000 years, the earth circumscribes the polar sky.

The signs as we see them in (Tropical) Astrology are symbolic and not as the Vedic Astrologers see them, (Sidereal) as they really are in the sky. This does not mean that they are not functional - both systems work but use different ways or rules to interpret.

We, that is Tropical Astrologers, use as Astronomers do 00:00 degrees Aries as our point of reference ... as sidereal astrologers use the background stars as their reference. Every 26,000 years these two reference points coincide as they did in about 60BC or as the Indian government suggests 221 AD... The difference is referred to as Ayanamsa a Sanskrit word meaning difference in longitude. As it stands today that difference is about 24 degrees (Pisces) and is moving backwards, which means it has about 6 degrees x 72 years before it goes into Aquarius.

So what you see in the sky at present is indeed Venus in the constellation of the Crab until it reaches 24 degrees of Leo, then it is seen in the constellation of Leo, it does not alter our meaning as I stated we use 00:00 Aries as our reference.

I hope this goes some way in helping you ... if you would like to know more please see me at the next meeting and I will help you to understand this.

*September Speakers Report
Hygeia – Goddess of Wellbeing*

The delightful Tess Cullen needs no introduction to the members of the AANSW. Again she enchanted us in attendance with the Goddesses, this time Hygeia, Goddess of Health and Wellbeing. Goddesses remind us of the feminine and the Asteroids that were named after them at the time of the re-emergence of the feminine in the early 1800's.

Tess took us on the journey of her personal discovery of this Asteroid in her own life (which sits just outside her Ascendant) whilst on holiday in Ireland.

In the ancient Greek times- Hygeia, discovered in 1849, was invited into the home of all people for good health and a disease free life.

Hygeia is the daughter of Esclepius and was a herbalist of the Hellenistic era. Out of the seven of his children, it was Hygeia who carried on his work of healing and developed a cult following of her own. By visiting her temple her followers fasted and were purified by being taught to visualise their wellness. They were taught to find inner strength and taught to be within thyself- a very feminine or Yin principle, which is expressed as a New Age concept but is thousands of years old.

Hygeia was, up until recently, listed in the Hippocratic Oath for all doctors. She is always pictured with a snake and the cup of life- the symbols of transformation. Like her name suggests- she is akin to hygiene and therefore likened to the sign of Virgo. Like much of the feminine past, it is difficult to find information about Hygeia.

Tess is amazing when it comes to the Asteroids/Goddesses. Even if this is not your branch of Astrology, she certainly brings the spirit of the feminine alive and back into our ancient craft.

TO ERR IS....ER?...HUMAN

SATURN IN VIRGO

It's a perennial mystery - what happens to all the lost socks in the universe. Do they somehow mutate into one, or is there a shadowy world inside clothes dryers and washing baskets that engulfs them in a black hole of anti-matter? If anyone eventually finds the answer, it may be an individual with Saturn in Virgo. They have the knack to spot the pattern within the matrix, to conjure control within chaos, and to engineer solutions to the most exacting problems.

The Mechanistic Universe

A prime example was mathematician and engineer Sir Charles Babbage, born with this placement. He formed the very Virgoan 'Analytical Society' and deduced that past weather ages could be deciphered from examining concentric tree ring patterns. But his "piece de resistance" was the Analytical Engine. This was the first mechanical digital computer, capable of performing any calculation set before it, and printing the result. Prior to Charles nobody had ever conceived such a contraption, let alone attempted to construct it. Babbage was driven by the removal of human error, a dislike of untidiness and love of calculus.

Steve Wosniak, the designer behind Apple computers was another with the same astro-signature. Automation, the computer and the machine are the wheels that turn our world - even if it is the spirit, which ultimately drives them. From September 02 2007 Saturn will return to the fastidious sign of Virgo, and impress itself upon universal consciousness - not fully departing until July 21 2010. The regulatory nature of Virgo, a scrupulous and exacting sign, leaves little to chance. Perhaps the advice that perfection is a direction rather than a destination may be appropriate, for this generational change.

The Ultimate Control Freak

The Saturn in Virgo meticulousness was aptly parodied, in the character of fault-finding, anal-retentive Felix Unger. Felix is famous for the line, "Everyone thinks I'm a hypochondriac. It makes me sick!" He was the pill-popping, clean freak half of television's Emmy Award winning Odd Couple series. Felix was constantly picking up the gauntlets thrown down by the unshaven, beer slurping housemate Oscar Madison. Felix's real life character, Tony Randall, was able to hilariously access his own Virgo Saturn, also closely tied to his birth Sun and Moon, making it infinitely more judgmental.

Parodies aside, the purist nature of Virgo benefits the health related industries where chance factors suggest critical errors. Chemistry is one area of science that benefits remarkably from this Virgo emphasis, if past evidence is to be repeated.

Mobilising People Power

China has been one country that has risen from the most populous and isolationist culture, to a leading world player, under Saturn in Virgo. Saturn's last three visitations coincided with pivotal periods of Chinese development. July 1 1921, was the official founding date for the Communist Party of China, and subsequent rise of the enigmatic leader Mao Zedong. Mao took China from a sleeping rural economy to a unified world power. Saturn's next sojourn in Virgo locked in a week before the release of George Orwell's classic totalitarian big brother world of "1984".

It marked the creation of the People's Republic of China. Mao's violent revolution had taken the lives of millions of dissidents. Such potential was evident in the intensely explosive Sun/Mars/Pluto conjunction of the original Communist Party horoscope. And it was further reflected in the Mars/Pluto conjunction of the People's Republic chart of October 01 1949 at 03.15 pm.

Mao's death, in 1976, signalled a power shift and further political purge. The next Saturn Virgo visit, from 1978, ushered in a new regime headed by Deng Xiaoping. The same year, China became the first nation to register one billion people, instituted sweeping reforms to state-owned industries, and introduced birth control via the one-child policy. (Also on July 25 1978, the world's first "test-tube baby", Louise Brown, was born in Oldham, England using invitro-fertilization)

The reorganisation of the world's largest labour force, and subsequent free-market reform now sees the world's oldest culture boasting the world's fastest growing economy. With Saturn entrenched in Virgo they play host to the 2008 Beijing Olympics. No doubt this period will take them to a new level in political influence, national direction and military power.

The Usa And Iran

The Iranian Islamic Revolution of February 1 1979, created the first modern theocracy, when Saturn last travelled through Virgo. Militant students besieged the US Embassy, November 4 1979, taking US citizens hostage. This resulted in a 440-day standoff between the Ayatollah and the US Carter Administration. Not until Saturn departed Virgo were the hostages finally released.

Today, under similar celestial conditions, another bitter opponent of the US has arisen. Iranian PM Mahmoud Ahmadinejad, already has temporarily detained British sailors. A political ploy, or the precursor of growing antagonism? And does the Shi-ite influence in Iraq, suggest a similar revolution underfoot?

Iran and the US occupy opposite sides of the political seesaw; something that can easily become increasingly obvious during the current Saturn stopover. And yet every new Saturn cycle provides the opportunity for an unfoldment, and unravelling, of the previous one. On that evolutionary basis, hang the hopes of a better tomorrow.

Power To The Women

In what may be construed as a planetary positive for Democrat Hilary Clinton's Presidential bid, the Saturn in Virgo cycle has been traditionally beneficial to women in politics. With the administrative planet in the sign of female ethics in 1921, Nancy Astor became Britain's first female Member of Parliament.
